The tables repeated by major race and ethnicity groups are identified with the letters A through I:


- A. White alone
- B. Black or African American alone
- C. American Indian and Alaska Native (AIAN) alone
- D. Asian alone
- E. Native Hawaiian and Other Pacific Islander (NHPI) alone
- F. Some Other Race alone
- G. Two or More Races
- H. Hispanic or Latino
- I. White alone, not Hispanic or Latino

- The number of children.

GEOGRAPHY

- Nation
- States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico

The S-DHC is provided for limited geographies because of concerns about meeting data quality and accuracy standards given confidentiality considerations.



RACE AND ETHNICITY: MAKING COMPARISONS

- Consider improvements to how we collected, coded and tabulated race data.
 - Blog: <u>Improvements to the 2020 Census Race and Hispanic Origin Question Designs, Data Processing,</u> and Coding Procedures
- Use caution when comparing 2020 Census Asian, NHPI and AIAN race data with 2019 or earlier American Community Survey (ACS) data.
 - Improvements were implemented in the ACS in 2020.
- The 2020 Census Hispanic origin data from the ethnicity question **are** comparable with the 2010 Census and with the ACS regardless of data year.



HOUSEHOLD TYPE: COMPARISONS WITH 2010 CENSUS

Inclusion of same-sex couples

Same-sex married couplesIf no children or other relatives present – edited and shown as unmarried partners and included in nonfamily households.

2020
Same-sex married couples
Included in estimates of families
because they are married couples.

 The household type 2020 Census data are generally comparable with the ACS data.

TENURE: COMPARISONS WITH 2010

- No major changes to housing questions from 2010.
- Housing data are generally comparable to the 2010 Census and the American Community Survey (ACS).



SO WHY USE THE S-DHC?

- Based on the 2020 Census data
 - Despite challenges during collection, over a tens of million households directly responded to the census
 - Far more responses than any Census survey, including the ACS
