

Final Recommendations from the Race and Ethnicity Interagency Working Group
For Updating Statistical Policy Directive No. 15:
Standards for Maintaining, Collecting, and Presenting Federal Data on Race and Ethnicity

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#### Timeline for Revising SPD 15

- → June 2022: Chief Statistician of the United States (CSOTUS) announced formal review to revise SPD 15 and convening of Federal Interagency Technical Working Group on Race and Ethnicity Standards (Working Group)
- → January 2023: OMB released Federal Register Notice which includes Working Group's initial proposals on revising SPD 15, open from January 27 April 27
- → 2023: ITWG reviewed public FRN comments, continued to engage with stakeholders, assessed evidence, deliberated and developed final recommendations from the Working Group.
- → March 2024: OMB published the revised SPD 15 Race and Ethnicity standards.



## Topic 1: Collect Race and Ethnicity Information Using One Combined Question

## Working Group's Initial Proposals:

 Combine the Race and Ethnicity questions (from 1997) into one Race/Ethnicity question for information collection

#### **Summary of Public Input:**

- Many thought the two-question format was confusing, especially those who identify as Hispanic/Latino or who don't identify with any of the 1997 race categories
- Emphasize that respondents should select all categories that apply to them
- Concern undercount of Afro-Latinos
- Concern conflation of two distinct concepts and implying that Hispanic/Latino is a "race"

#### Working Group's Final Recommendations:

- Single, combined Race and Ethnicity question for both self-response and proxy responses
- Encourage multiple responses



# Topic 2: Add Middle Eastern or North African (MENA) as a New Minimum Category

## Working Group's Initial Proposals:

- Add MENA to SPD 15 as a new, distinct minimum reporting category
- White category should be revised to remove MENA

#### **Summary of Public Input:**

- Nearly all comments addressing MENA supported the proposal
- 1997 classification of MENA as White does not reflect the reality for many who are MENA
- Feedback on which groups should have a checkbox
- Opposed some MENA consider themselves to be White

#### Working Group's Final Recommendations:

 Same as initial proposal

## Topic 3: Require the Collection of Detailed Race & Ethnicity Categories (default)

## Working Group's Initial Proposals:

- Require more granular data collection than minimum categories\*
- Specific detailed checkboxes\*\*

OMB Interagency Technical Working Group on Race and Ethnicity Standards

#### **Summary of Public Input:**

- Overall support for proposal
- Several health orgs stressed importance of having data for detailed groups to measure differences in healthcare outcomes
- Flexibility for changes to demographics
- Concern burden on Federal agencies
- Concern risks to data privacy and disclosure for small populations groups
- Concern burden on respondents

#### Working Group's Final Recommendations:

 Detailed data with flexibility to meet program & stakeholder needs\*\*\*

\*\*\* Federal agencies may seek approval from OIRA to use the minimum reporting categories.

<sup>\*</sup>Exemptions can be requested

<sup>\*\*</sup> Representing the six largest population groups within each minimum category, except MENA

#### Topic 4: Updates to Terminology in SPD 15

### Working Group's Initial Proposals:

- Remove certain terms or phrases in the minimum category definitions
- Update language

#### **Summary of Public Input:**

- General support for proposals
- Requested specifics in each definition

#### Working Group's Final Recommendations:

- Remove "majority" and "minority"
- Use "race and/or ethnicity" in question stem
- Encourage reporting multiple categories
- Use "Multiracial and/or Multiethnic" in tabulations



#### Topic 5: Implementation Guidance

## Working Group's Initial Proposals:

- Dates for agencies to incorporate revisions
- Bridging previous and revised data
- Collecting proxy data options
- Multiple category reporting

#### **Summary of Public Input:**

- Establishing implementation timeline for compliance
- Concerns about data consistency
- Tools to support bridging
- Transparency on how the data are collected even when not self-reported
- Tabulation
- Questions from the public about tabulations

#### Working Group's Final Recommendations:

Five implementation recommendations

- Two on planning and timing
- Three on how to improve the collection and reporting practices for race and ethnicity data
