Gender Identity

Gender Identity Work

- Over 350 cognitive interviews
 - Passports gender X
 - Employee management system
 - NCHS health surveys, gen pop
 - Spanish translation

Multiple rounds of Research and Development Survey

- RANDS 5 (n = 6,896)
 - Jan & March 2022
- RANDS 6 (n = 2,312)
 - Aug 2022
- RANDS 7 (n = 6,821)
 - Nov Dec 2022
- RANDS 8 (n = 16,648)
 - June July 2023

Cognitive Interview Findings: Response Process Differences

Gender minority

- Response process framed by opposing interests: Inclusion vs Privacy
- Fluid understanding of self; shifting identities
- Sophisticated understanding of concepts

Non-minority

- No risk in reporting
- Gender is typically understood as inherent and fixed
- Gender and sex are typically understood as the same
- Some respondents conflate 'sex,' 'gender,' with 'sexual orientation'

You may select more than one answer.

Are you:

- Female
- Male
- Transgender, non-binary, or another gender?

Mark all that apply

Complexity of R's understanding of self

Vocabulary

- 'Sex' and 'gender' not included
- Simple response format

3 Categories

- Self-administered context, limited space
- Gender minority categories collapsed for analysis

RANDS Background

- Research and Development Survey (RANDS)¹ program: ongoing series of surveys by the Division of Research and Methodology at NCHS using quantitative and mixed methods to assess measurement error, validity, and bias
- Currently administered by NORC at the University of Chicago, AmeriSpeak survey probability-based panel (+ opt-in non-probability for RANDS 8)
- RANDS 5, Jan & March, 2022 (n = 6,896)
 - 2 x 2 question order and question version experiment
- RANDS 8, June July, 2023 (n = 16,648)
 - Gender minority oversample (n > 700)
 - ½ sample three-item question, ½ sample single-item question



RANDS 5 Findings

- Self-rated health and self-rated mental health estimates varied for gender minority respondents based on treatment group
 - Gender minority Rs who were asked SAAB first with Version B of the gender identity question (Treatment Group D) had the lowest SRH and SRMH ratings
- Confirmation question likely not catching all misclassification

Effect of question type on self-rated mental health



RANDS 8 Results

- Similar performance between the single-item and the twostep on some measures
- For anxiety, question type mattered: significant differences between the twostep and the single-item for gender minority Rs


RANDS 5 Findings

- 1.2% chose 'something else' and wrote in a response (n = 84)
 - 70% of those responses could be back coded; other 30% protest, out of scope, or unclear
 - Codable responses: pansexual, asexual, queer, straight
 - Protest: "attack helicopter", "human being", disparaging remarks about trans people
 - Out of Scope: gender, race
 - Unclear: "CONFUSED", "kinkster, heteroflexible"

Something Else Close-Ended Probe: RANDS 6-9

- What do you mean by something else?
 - I am not straight, but identify with another label such as queer, trisexual, omnisexual, polysexual, or pansexual
 - I am asexual or on the asexual spectrum (including, but not limited to, demisexual and greysexual)
 - I have not figured out or am in the process of figuring out my sexuality
 - I do not use labels to identify myself
 - Something else, please explain:

RANDS 6-9 Close-Ended Probe Frequencies



RANDS 6-9 Findings

- Something else write-ins (n = 116, across all 4 rounds)
 - 49% could *possibly* be back coded; other 51% protest, out of scope, or unclear
 - Codable responses: queer, asexual, pansexual, straight
 - Protest: "human", "Walmart shopping cart", they're too old
 - Out of Scope: gender, straight people who really want to share about their sexual behavior
 - Unclear: sexual fluidity, people telling stories that don't clarify identity
 "i am different. i thought i would never be with a man, but my partner and i am getting our marriage annulled. and in process of dating a man"

Where We're Headed

- Moving forward with our single, non-binary gender identity question
- Tweaked the sexual identity close-ended probe, RANDS 11
 - What do you mean by something else?
 - I am not straight, but identify with another label such as queer, pansexual, or omnisexual
 - I am asexual or on the asexual spectrum

Simplified: removed demi and greysexual

Simplified: removed 'trisexual' and 'polysexual'
